Prior to his service in Afghanistan, Lieutenant Colonel Fenzel was a Director for Transnational Threats at the National Security Council from Sept 2000 - Nov 2001. In this capacity, he oversaw the coordination and implementation of U.S. counter-terrorism policy. He has also served as a Strategist and Policy Analyst for the Army Chief of Staff at the Pentagon. Mr. Fenzel received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics from the Johns Hopkins University in 1989 and a Master's degree in Public Administration from Harvard University in 1999. As an infantry officer in the U.S. Army, Mr. Fenzel led soldiers through Operation Desert Storm, served as a battalion logistics officer in Bosnia in 1995, commanded two paratrooper companies in Italy, and served as an airborne battalion executive officer in Iraq. Mr. Fenzel is a Term Member with the Council on Foreign Relations, and a former White House Fellow.
