#### **Synopsis:**

The teleconference is an opportunity for our members to join Scott Fitzgerald and Lee Wolosky in a spirited discussion on the subject addressing what impact our nation's recent legislation and executive orders (Patriot Act and Homeland Security Presidential Directive #3) have had on security inside our borders.

The sensitivity of this security issue has grown as the global war on terrorism continues to be waged and the battlefields of Iraq and Afghanistan continue are depicted so vividly by the media. During the discussion our presenters will provide their perspectives on the larger issue of how current policy is working as well as shed light on some of the following important questions:

- Has immigration policy gone too far or not far enough in addressing national security concerns?
- Without reform and refinement will existing policy prevent student exchange programs from fulfilling their intended purpose?
- What are the international implications of continuing our current stringent immigration policies?
- Is there an alternative course to the one the Bush Administration has chosen? If so, what tenets must be included in a follow-on policy?
- Where do vulnerabilities still exist and what measures must be taken to address them? Is it realistic to think that further change can be undertaken in the current domestic and international political environments?

**Lee S. Wolosky** practices corporate and international law at Boies, Schiller & Flexner LLP in New York and is an adjunct fellow at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) in Washington. Mr. Wolosky worked at the White House under Presidents Bill Clinton and George W. Bush as Director for Transnational Threats on the National Security Council staff. Prior to entering government service, Mr. Wolosky practiced corporate and international law at Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison in New York. He also served as International Affairs Fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations and Deputy Director of the Council's Economic Task Force on Russia. Mr. Wolosky is a cum laude graduate of Harvard Law School and a magna cum laude graduate of Harvard College. He is a term member of the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR), a member of the CFR Term Member Advisory Board, and a member of the Alliance for American Leadership (AAL).
